

After you have completed the painting of your cowboy or animal carving, mix 1/2 capful of oil paint...burnt sierra or burnt umber with a pint of boiled linseed oil. Saturate copiously the entire carving and wait about 30 minutes and wipe off. I do this 2-3 times for each carving. It fills in the dry wood and gives a waxed glow to the carving and makes it look more professional. Watch out for your soaked oil rags. They are combustible. I get my wife to wash them when I am through.

**Jake Heugel's** bob cat was from a Rossiter roughout which was realistically carved, and then mounted on a Philippine mahogany base.

Jim Roby brought his Big Horn Elk which won first place in the Austin competition and was sent on to Nationals. When he received it back, it was damaged and he had to recarve several parts, resulting once again in an impressive work of art. He also brought his deer head which he had power carved from one piece of wood. Amazing.
