Don't forget to put shadows in the V-Tooled areas of your carving. I use a 1/4" gouge and follow up with a V-Tool in all the armpit areas and where the arms bend etc. I also do the same on pants at the knees and where the pant leg rolls up over the boots.

Show & Tell

With no further business to discuss, all eyes turned to the show and tell table which had to be extended because of all the carvings. Each carving was unique, and many were the result of classes taken during the recent week in Fredericksburg. **Jo Cage** brought a cane she had been working on for some time, a lop eared bunny carved in Bob Bander's class, a Scandinavian caricature from **Jim Brinkman's** class, a really detailed and entertaining clown she had woodburned in Nedra Denison's class, and she had also completed the ax in a log from a past blank of the month and a lovely stylized wren perched on a log. Jo Comer also brought a cane she had completed which was her second one, a Scandinavian carving of a woman reading a book from Jim Brinkman's class, a lop eared bunny from Bob Bander's class, and she also had wood burned a realistic deer under the watchful eye of Nedra Denison. **Jeremy** Cuba brought a stylized bird he had mounted on a piece of polished wood, a Panda he had won in a previous raffle one

Tuesday night, and the fishin' lure also from a blank of the month.

Ed Jones brought a full sized saxophone which had taken over a year to carve. Some of the parts were carved a number of times until they were a perfect fit. It looked so real we lacked only someone with the skill to play it although Ed said some of the parts were permanently in place so that was not an option. Jake **Heugel** had completed his "working" fishin' lure and also a painted Eagle Head from past carving projects. He had carved and painted two of Jack Price's Little Monsters, and Bob Gaines' mouse on a stump. Jake had also taken 3rd place with his "red neck" caricature in the one-hour whittling contest. **Jim Roby** had brought his pieces of work in progress, a Stu Martin 3 - metal tool stands, adjustable heights, --Indian bust, and Phil Bishop's cowboy caricature. At the last minute he discovered his bow legged cowboy would fit on the caricature horse, so that was an unplanned extension of his project. We look forward to seeing them completed and painted, Jim. Bob Reese also carved Bob Gaines' mouse on a stump, and had completed the ax in a stump from a previous blank of the month. He took a mini class with Robert Miles and carved a hand holding a cross. From Charles Brookes' class he had carved an indian bust and added applicable mini-carvings on the base, a 49er prospector with fringes on his jacket from Gary Batte's class, and a santa and caricature from Phil Bishop's class. Dwight Vance brought his mosquito complete with hockey stick and boxin' gloves. Buddy Streetman had carved a hand holding a cross with a pin mounted or the back. He also had carved the Indian bust with Stu Martin.

Now, I don't think I missed anyone, but it is evident that a lot of chips flew in Fredericksburg, and the results were awesome. Even when several club members carved from the same rough out, or under the guidance of the same instructor, the end results were special and reflected the creative imaginations of the individual carvers. Well done carvers!!!


