I want to add a personal word of thanks to **Jo Cage** who stood in for me at the August meeting and prepared the minutes for our newsletter last month.


We should have lots of show and tell items at our October meeting as members share the projects they completed during the week in Fredericksburg. See you at Fredericksburg or in October at our meeting.




Parker Jumper on carving stand on rollers. Original cost \$960. Approx. 48" tall x 60" length. Will take \$750
