

# **REESE'S PIECES for the NOVICE**

After I have used the linseed oil on my carving to put a final finish on it, I like to re-burnish the fuzzies. It seems as if they are easier to push back into crevices and gives the carving a more professional look. I use a bamboo Chinese chop sticks with one end pointed and the other cut with a flat surface about 1/2 inch long. Make it like a thin flat head screwdriver.
