Newt LeBlanc had chip carved a lovely hinged book stand, with a natural finish. Lots of time went into the design resulting in a very attractive piece.

Fred McLeroy mounted the crucifix he carved recently on a piece of Plexiglas, which was most impressive. He had also carved a stylized crucifix bearing the face of Jesus from a piece of Juniper root.

Fred had also carved a 5 inch or so stylized lizard from sycamore.

Clarence Born had been busy carving several small spotted dogs, fashioned after a Tom Wolfe pattern, two green caricature alligators, and completed a gray rabbit from a recent blank of the month (photo not available).

Our youngest carver, Julius Van Tassell, brought his first carving, the wooden spoon from a recent blank of the month.
