The show and tell table held many interesting items. Dan Gillen had carved a Kokopelli dancer from butternut which always finishes off so attractively. He had also carved a Santa face ornament, and a charming little teddy bear.

Diann Small brought a Santa carving she completed in a class taught by Adair and Patty Rucker during the week in New Braunfels. She carved the Santa with Adair, and painted the Santa using Patty's technique, resulting in a very impressive piece of work.

Diann had also completed a very colorful and attractive walking stick from aspen wood.

Buddy Streetman brought a realistic Big Horn Ram carving which reflected many hours of carving and painting.

Harvey Beauchemin had carved a polar bear stretched out on a rock, with a couple of fish nearby.

Clarence Born had carved some previous blanks of the month with little bears sitting atop cowboy boots, with two very tiny replicas also. He had also carved Santas on two pencils, one a plastic pencil and one from wood.
