




A huge thanks to Jo Cage and her committee. They did a great job organizing the party and are much appreciated.



Our Show and Tell was as interesting as ever with work from several of our fine carvers. Chas Chapot brought two fine examples of his sign making. One out of mahogany in the shape of a banner and the other out of bass wood. Norm Hein had finished a small nativity like the ones the two Jo's had done in the evening classes

at Fredricksburg but he had added and placed them in a neat stable that added to the set up. Jerry Elliot brought his cane of different woods pegged together which was outstanding. Sue Sweeney brought her totally different cane that she had made from a blank of Don Hartt. Also finished beautifully. Jim Roby had finished his Cavalry soldier and explained to us the process with which he had achieved a beautiful finish. He used Bix stain with a little burnt umber added first. He let it dry overnight and then brushed it all over with MinWax for dark woods, thinned with mineral spirits until it was the consistency of melted butter. And again let it dry overnight and brushed it the next day with a shoe brush. He specified the brush be a new one. He repeated the last step three times. It really showed the effort he put into it. Thanks for sharing the steps with us, Jim. Finishing a project is so important.

The meeting broke up and everyone stayed to carve the blank of the Month brought by Diann Small and Ed Jones of the Long Horn Steer. Tom Sarff showed up with a box of all kinds of blanks which are much appreciated by those of us that don't have saws to cut them out ourselves. Thanks Tom.

A wonderful book on carving techniques was donated by one of our members and I wrote his name in the inside of the book, but by the time I got home, I forgot his name (my age is showing) so I will thank him next time. You now see why I am glad to give up this job to our new secretary.


