She was here in the fall and took a course from **Jim Roby** but now plans on coming more regularly and joining us on Wednesday mornings .Welcome!

Treasurer **Jim Roby** reported that we now have \$1335.06 in our treasury after paying for our insurance for the year and the newsletter expenses . \$42 was taken in by the club from the blank of the month for April ( which turned out to be a challenge for all of us who participated.

The Blank of the Month for May is a hair barrette brought with instructions by **Fred Hartman**. Thanks Fred and all the other carvers who give their time and expertise to seeing that we have interesting blanks to carve each month.

**Diann Small** reported that Walter Werther is interested in coming to Austin to do a class for \$75 each including the blank, if there are at least 8 participants. We would have a choice of a bear, a buffalo, a cat, giraffe or goat. It would be for a Friday night, all day Saturday, and Sunday. A tentative sign -up sheet was circulated.

Those signing up for helping with Set Up/Clean Up for our June 14th meeting are **Sue Sweeney, Dick Pritchett,** and **Jim Roby**.

An example of the Eagle Cane Operation , lent to us by Ed Moore from Ft.Collins , was brought and is being lent to us to keep until we do ours. Kits probably won't be available until late June or July. These canes are for Texas soldiers who have been wounded during this was . Our club will pay for the kits so lets all get involved. A sign-up sheet was passed.

Anyone who is without a name-tag should let **Sue Sweeney** know.

The main event of the meeting was what we were all interested in and that was our Show and Tell. Everyone reported that a good time was had by all in Fredricksburg.

**Buddy Streetman** and **Jake Heugel** brought their finished river otters done in Dee Gibson's class. Painting was done with a cut off paint brush and dry brushed. Bark was under cut with saw, or using a hot wood burner was burned almost black, then brushed off with a toothbrush.

Hair was done with a disc shaped diamond tool. Excellent work done by both men but each with these fine carvers own touches. An interesting family group of giraffes were carved by **Jim Roby** in the class of Walter Wharton who comes from Dallas. Jim said he was a very good instructor. (back part of giraffe was missing). **Jim Brinkman** brought his finished Indian bust done in Roy Waterhouse's class. Jim explained the various techniques that he (Jim) used to get the variety of colors in the hair, the braids, and the face. It was beautifully finished overall with a coat of paste wax diluted with mineral spirits. Job well done. **Sue Sweeney** brought her results of the several one day classes that she enjoyed, a nativity scene carved within an egg in a class by Mrs. Sprowl; continued her excellent bark carvings in a class with Charley Erickson whom she found to be an excellent teacher, and an interesting wood burning in a class by Patty Rucker, another good teacher. Other Show and Tell contributions were several pretty leaves by **Diann Small** from last month's blank of the month as well as one carved by **Joe Hell** who also shared with us a chain carved by his father-in-law from a broom stick . The resulting chain is over 6 ft long! **Johnny Dunlop** brought a "poor man's vice" that he had made out of various pipes and fittings. He brought a list of needed parts and said it was made for about \$16. Shows what you can do with a little ingenuity!

Following Show and Tell the monthly raffle was held and winners were **Bob Tucker, Jake Heugel, Dorothy Turner, Newton Le Blanc** and **Don Gillen**. Rest of evening was spent carving.
