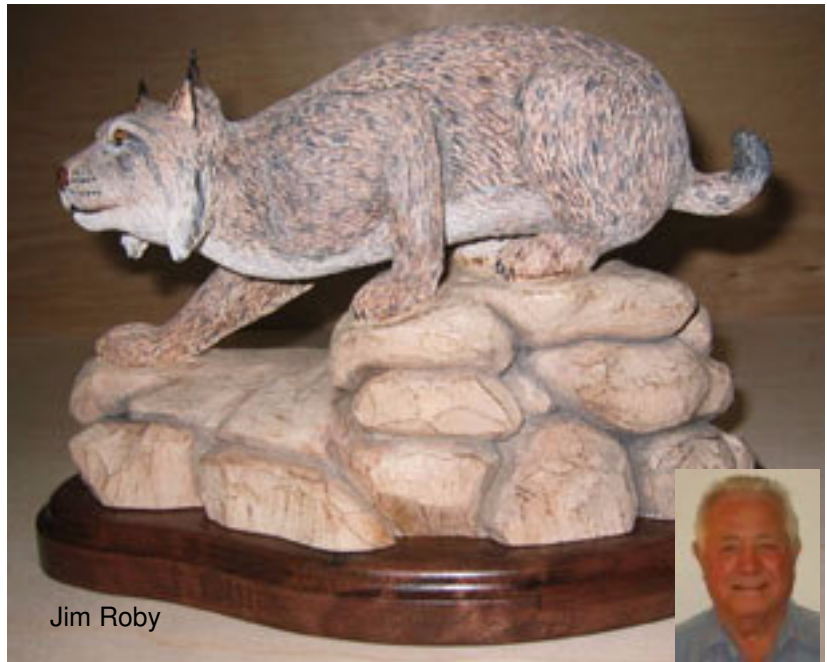

Gail Lynn had received the club patches which will be available to club members for \$2.00 each.

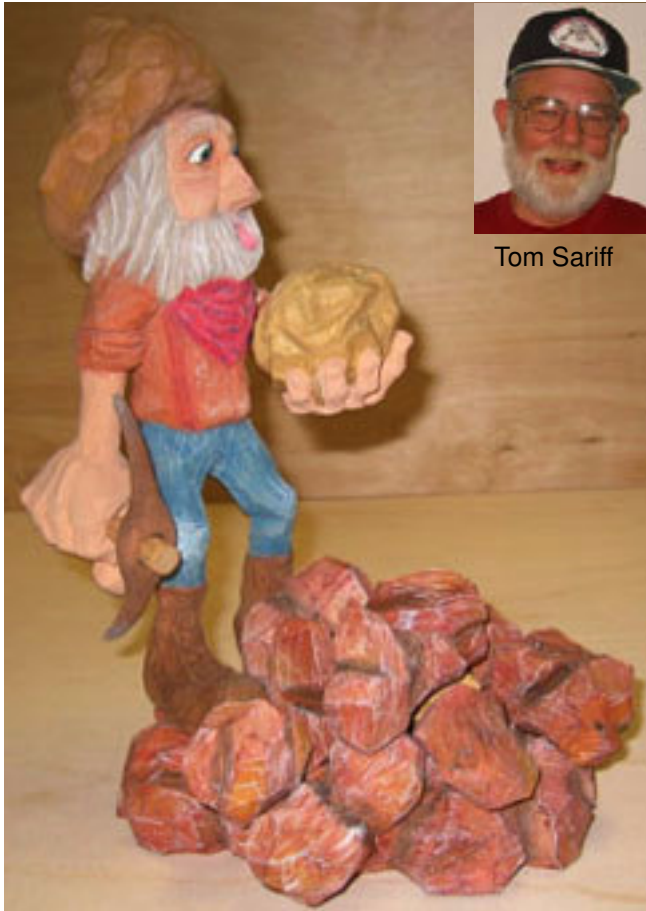
Our July blank of the month will be provided by Gail Lynn, a wooden knife sheath, which will be a fun project as well as most useful.

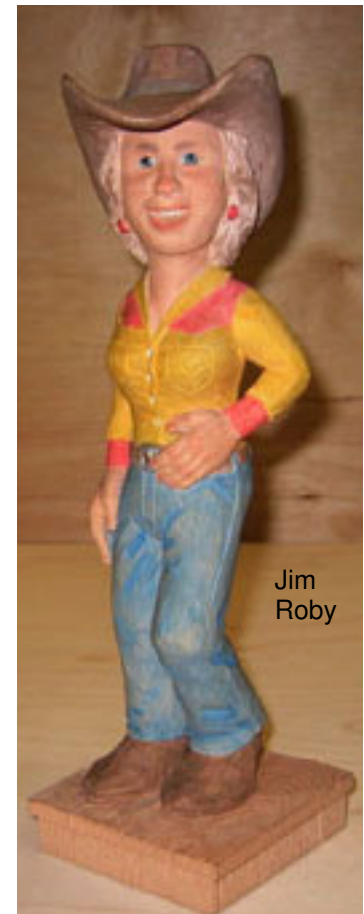
